Voters services:

According to reports from many different sources, Wisconsin had an historic turn-out of voters (40%) for a Spring Election. By the numbers-

1.7 million voters cast ballots in the Spring Election.

Burnett, Polk and St Croix counties were all carried by Daniel Kelly. Burnett-5344 ballots cast/ Kelly with 61% Janet with 39% Polk-13,178 ballots cast/ Kelly with 59% Janet with 41% St Croix-28,781 ballots/ Kelly with 53% Janet with 47%

All three statewide ballot measures passed... overwhelmingly.

Thank you, League members, for your participation in our democracy! Whether it's planting signs, making calls, talking with friends and family about voting and elections, or working the polls. Your actions add up to a success we can celebrate. It's an exciting time to be involved with LWVSCV!

Wisconsin's (estimated) voting age population is 4,676,183 with over 3,591,117 registered voters. The difference between the persons eligible to vote and the number that are registered is **over one million**.

What opportunity does the League have to serve the large number of people that are eligible and yet unregistered to vote?

Although there are many reasons and motivations for someone to cast a ballot, we don't know of any good reason not to. So we need to find out 'why'!

Our mission to inform and educate the electorate continues to expand.

Voter Services is looking to explore engagement of young voters and voters that are disenfranchised due to ability, transportation, gender, ethnicity.


