Do you know people who are mystified by the voting process? All those different elections and deadlines can be overwhelming! How does a busy person begin to wade through it all?

Call Vote Boosters!

The Greater Chippewa Valley LWV shared details of different voter registration scenarios using MyVote. Please take time to watch the video and become familiar with Online Voter Registration (OVR).


2024 Election Calendar

In odd numbered years, there are only spring elections, which generally cover county and municipal elections.

When Planning Voter Registration Events

Be mindful of deadlines:

- 20 days before an election: last day for online and mail vote registration
- 14 days before an election: last day suggested to request an absentee ballot online

Tips on responding to misinformation and disinformation!

Election Mis and Disinformation

Election mis and disinformation is a danger to American democracy. It interferes with voters' ability to understand and participate in political processes. Falsehoods spread rapidly on social media, with platforms unwilling or unable to intervene, feuling threats to our election systems.

Misinformation vs. Disinformation

- Unintentionally misleading, false, or inaccurate information.
- Intentionally misleading, false, or inaccurate information intended to deceive.

How to stop the spread?

- Do not amplify
 - Do not comment
 - Do not like
 - Do not share
- Do not argue
 - Creating a defensive posture pushes someone deeper into their corner and makes it harder to communicate.
- Report the misinformation
 - Report it directly to the social media site and to the LWVWI <u>Junkipedia</u> tipline

(borrowed from Delany Zimmer, League of Women Voters Wisconsin)

- Do not embarrass
 - Ridiculing someone, especially with derogatory language, won't result in a positive or receptive response.
- Do not contradict using only a fact checking website.
 - Fact checks are important, but when you share them without context or further discussion, you can reinforce the district of the site
