

The League of Women Voters St Croix Valley is proud to participate again this year during the second annual Valley Wide Pride Event.


Members plan to set up a booth to display our LWV-SCV educational materials as part of our DEI policy. We look forward to seeing members there on

In these hyper partisan times, the League of Women Voters stands out because of its long history of nonpartisanship. It behooves us all to take extra care this election season to maintain that stance. League leaders have a special responsibility to refrain from appearing with candidates and political parties. This does not, of course, absolve us from participating in the democratic process, which is the mission of the League. Simply put, if you have a leadership role in the League, be it local, state or national, you cannot accept a leadership role in a political group. The grassroots structure of the League means there are both formal (board and officers) and informal leaders

Hispanic Health Fair at West Immanuel Lutheran Church in Osceola April 27, 2024

LWVSCV were asked to represent and offer voter educational materials by Kim Vicek of the Greater Chippewa Valley LWV. Kim's contact and the Health Fair organizer was Lidixe Montoya. Lidixe was a rural medical doctor in El Salvador for eight years and is now working as an ELCA Mission developer and started the Neighbor to Neighbor Together in Ministry: A bridge between Anglo Lutheran

and the Hispanic Community. We gladly accepted.

Voter Services and Member Services offered Spanish language voter education materials. We were among many service organizations represented at the health fair. The church Ukulele Ministry group played and sang the entire time, 10:00 to 1:00. We had tacos and enjoyed meeting and interacting with community, church, and service organization members. Some of the community members may not be voters, however, we were honored to be a presence and communicated with many about the importance of voting in the August and November elections.

Services offered included WIC, Lions Club vision screening, Polk County Community Services, St. Croix Valley Family Resource Center, Rural Voices Oral History Recording Project, and The Open Cupboard of Osceola. There was a strong spiritual community energy there, and we were honored to be a part of that and hope to continue this service.



Voter Services

LWV SCV has made great strides getting information into the hands of first time voters through the High School and College outreach initiative. The spinning wheel with accompanying civic questions and candy are magical in attracting interest. We are working to get school spirit bookmarks made for each of the high schools. The front of the bookmark is inspirational and the back is informational (How to register to vote).

Nineteen members of LWV SCV have signed onto an event, or acted as ambassador to set up an event at a school. With twenty schools (17 HS & 3 colleges) in our three county area to serve, these members are making great headway. We are so very grateful for their efforts and still are in need of more volunteers to help.

We are looking for members to adopt schools, specifically, Siren, Luck and Baldwin/Woodville. Grantsburg HS has opened their doors to us, but as this is the last week of school, we will schedule something in the fall. Voter Services has information needed for contact with the high school.
