

Sunflowers and Busy Bees! It's official! Summertime has begun.



Farmers' Market Demo Coffee

On Tuesday, May 28, an enthusiastic group of Farmers' Market volunteers braved a threat of rain to practice their promotional skills to get voter information out to the public. They had a chance to discuss just how it might go and to see how spinning the wheel is done. There will be questions geared to each individual that stops by and each person will be able to choose from a variety of small prizes. There also

are a number of informational materials available to hand out. Interacting with the public in this way will give us a chance to encourage voter registration, answer questions about voting and elections, and put a face on the League of Women Voters.

Additionally, volunteers had a chance to observe the setup of the canopy. This should help both with rain and sun. After a collaboration of expertise and a lot of laughs, we managed to get it in place. After one practice, we think we are good to go and we also have located a perfect video that we wish we had watched first. Due to the popularity of the canopy, two more have been ordered.

We have 7 markets who have opened their doors to us, with 12 different time slots for the months of June and July. There are 16 members who have volunteered to help. All slots have been filled except a partner for Nanette DelMonico in St. Croix Falls. She has experience, so just needs someone with any amount (or no) experience to join her at the SCF Library on July 6 from 10–1. A Memo From the State Office

A memo from the State Office regarding nonpartisanship:

In these hyper partisan times, the League of Women Voters stands out because of its long history of nonpartisanship. It behooves us all to take extra care this election season to maintain that stance. League leaders have a special responsibility to refrain from appearing with candidates and political parties. This does not, of course, absolve us from participating in the democratic process, which is the mission of the League. Simply put, if you have a leadership role in the League, be it local, state or national, you cannot accept a leadership role in a political group. The grassroots structure of the League means there are both formal (board and officers) and informal leaders
