
"do something"

This November, voters will have another harmful, divisive constitutional amendment on their ballot. We will show up and vote no and keep Wisconsin moving forward. Our voting rights are literally on the ballot with this amendment. The language change

from "every" to "only "is a downgrade to all of our voting rights. The language changes our constitutionally protected voting rights from a guarantee for all citizens to a limitation that could be used to erode our voting rights.

JOINT STATEMENT FROM WISCONSIN VOTING RIGHTS GROUPS

Wisconsin Organizations Applaud WI Supreme Court Decision to Reinstate Drop Boxes

MADISON – We, the undersigned organizations, celebrate the Wisconsin State Supreme Court's Decision to reinstate drop boxes which are essential to Wisconsin voters.

• Regular mail/online voter registration deadline: Wednesday, Oct. 16

- The last day to request an absentee ballot is October 31
- The last day to mail an absentee ballot is October 29
- Regular in-person voter registration deadline: Friday, Nov. 1
- Deadline to return an absentee ballot: Tuesday, Nov. 5
- General election: Tuesday, Nov. 5
