LWV Declares United States in a "Constitutional Crisis,"



May 1: League of Women Voters Launches 'Unite and Rise 8.5' Initiative

LWV Launches New Initiative to Mobilize 8.5
Million Voters Through Advocacy, Civic Education, and Engagement (May 1, 2025)

Washington, DC — ..., the League of Women Voters of the United States, a century-old nonpartisan organization, launched a powerful new initiative, <u>Unite and Rise 8.5</u>, which aims to engage and mobilize 8.5 million voters through advocacy, civic education, and community engagement. On April 17, 2025, Celina Stewart, CEO of the League of Women Voters, and Dianna Wynn, president of the League of Women Voters, took the serious step of <u>labelling our current moment a constitutional crisis</u>, and concurrently announced the *Unite and Rise 8.5* initiative.

"In the first 100 days of the Trump administration, as our constitution and rule of law have been assailed, the democracy movement has been on the defensive," said Celina Stewart, CEO of the League of Women Voters of the United States. "Today, that changes. *Unite and Rise 8.5* embodies a proactive, positive vision of what America can be — something that anyone who cares about democracy, no matter their party affiliation, can participate in. More than 105 years ago, women of all political leanings fought together for the freedom to vote, and the unprecedented political moment we find ourselves in today demands we take action to lead a movement again."
